



IMPORT RESTRICTIONS **ANNOUNCED** ON HORSES FROM **L**EXAS

TALLAHASSEE – Florida Agriculture and Consumer Services Commissioner Charles Bronson announced today the imposition of import restrictions on horses coming into Florida from Texas following the discovery of hundreds of Texas horses positive for Theileria equi, one of two organisms responsible for causing Equine Piroplasmosis (EP).

Bronson is requiring horses from Texas to have blood tests to check for Theileria equi within thirty days of entry into Florida, have a health certificate, be checked for ticks that carry EP and be sprayed with a pesticide no more than two weeks before their arrival in Florida.

EP is considered a foreign animal disease, not endemic to the United States. It is a blood-borne parasitic disease primarily transmitted between horses by ticks or contaminated needles and is not directly contagious from one horse to another. Ticks are the natural method of transmission of the EP organisms, and the tick species known to be efficient at transmitting EP is not believed to be in Florida.

Acutely affected horses can have depression, fever, anemia, jaundiced (yellow) mucous membranes and can die from the disease. In its milder form, EP can also cause horses to have roughened hair coats, constipation, colic, generalized weakness, and lack of appetite. Some horses become chronic carriers of the disease, showing little clinical signs but have the ability to transmit the disease to other horses via ticks. Treatment of infected horses has not been shown to be effective in eliminating the organism(Theileria equi), and infected horses must remain under quarantine.

The establishment of Equine Piroplasmosis and associated vector ticks would seriously threaten the horses and equine industry of Florida, which produces goods and services of more than \$3 billion per year.

"We are being very proactive in testing horses that came in contact with positive horses that were imported from Texas over the past few years since we are not sure how long the problem has existed in Texas," Bronson said. "This is a serious disease, and we must take all precautions necessary to prevent the spread of this disease as well as to prevent the introduction of any ticks that are carriers of the disease."

Ten horses that were exposed to EP in Texas and traveled into Florida before the outbreak was discovered have been located, tested and quarantined. Five of those horses have tested positive for the organism. The State Veterinarian's Office is working with the owners to test all horses exposed in Florida and to minimize the risk to other horses in the state. So far no horses that were exposed to horses imported from Texas have tested positive.

Because some states have placed import restrictions on all states with positive horses, the Florida State Veterinarian's Office recommends that anyone traveling out of state with their horse to call the state of destination to ensure there are no additional requirements enacted associated with this outbreak.

DIY Horse and Human Treats

Both you and your horse will enjoy these old-fashioned gingersnap cookies, made with molasses, butter or margarine, brown sugar, and spices.

Cook Time: 10 minutes

Ingredients:

- 2 3/4 cups self-rising flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon ginger
- 1/4 teaspoon cloves
- 1 cup brown sugar, packed
- 3/4 cup margarine or butter, softened
- 1 egg
- 1/4 cup light molasses

Preparation:

Combine flour, soda, and spices in a bowl and set aside. Cream sugar and margarine. Beat in egg and molasses until light and fluffy. Stir in flour mixture just until blended. Chill for 2 hours or more. Preheat oven to 375 degrees.

Shape dough into 3/4-inch balls, roll in granulated sugar, and place on lightly greased baking sheets about 2 inches apart. Flatten each ball with the bottom of a glass dipped in sugar. Bake about 8 to 10 minutes, until set.

Makes 8 dozen cookies.



Do horse boots support the leg? Do they interfere with jumping?



Do sport boots support a horse's leg structure? Would you be able to recommend a particular type? Also, do they interfere when jumping a horse?



Sport or galloping boots do provide some support for horses' legs, but they are mostly used for their protective properties. They prevent the horse from injuring its legs as a result of interference when galloping or from knocking a fence pole hard. I have never heard of them interfering when the horse is

jumping. I always use them when jumping in the ring and when riding cross-country. Jumpers will often wear open front boots, but I prefer to use fully closed boots for cross-country.

There are some good "sports medicine boots" that claim to give the horse lots of support. However, I am not sure that there is research to support this. These boots do have a part that wraps around and under the fetlocks to (theoretically) provide some support. There is a German company that makes some very nice leather boots, but they are expensive. Other manufacturers produce a wide variety of leather boots as well. You can always purchase cheap boots, but they do not last long and provide little protection yet alone any support. I would definitely say "you get what you pay for" in this situation. You need to decide whether you want a Velcro closure or leather buckle; either is fine, depending on your personal taste. Your best option is to go into a tack store and look at what they have. You can also ask around at your barn or at shows to learn which ones people prefer.

Here is a guide to help you when deciding which type of boots to buy:

- Open Front Splint Boots protect the side and hind shin from brushing and over-reaching
- Galloping Boots protect against bruising from the opposite foot and from high over-reaches into the tendon area. They also help prevent shoe bruises. This boot wraps around the ankle and gives tendon support. This boot style is used for jumping or dressage.
- Ankle Boots protect against interference injuries only. This boot protects only the ankle.
- Bell Boots protect against over-reaches and coronet band injuries.
- **Skid Boots** are used on stock horses to protect the sensitive heel and the back of the ankle in sliding stops.
- Event, Polo, or Cross Country Boots give maximum protection against interference. The fleece and felt keep the legs warm and supple without blistering. They can also be used for shipping, galloping or turning out.
- **Tendon Boots** are used for sweating legs or with cotton or quilts for shipping, galloping or turning out.
- Closed Front Shin and Ankle Boots give protection to the ankle and shin all around.





I bought lots of ponies because ponies were my childhood dream since I was small!


And seeing a little kid with a smile on a pony, that's the very best gift of all!

"Yes Virginia, I am a Cowboy."



Equine Dental Maintenance


He is now living and practicing in Florida. He uses hand tools verses power tools to shape and balance the teeth. By using a calm and gentle approach, Mr. Ward does not need to sedate the horses.

When You Train or Ride Your Horse Is He:

- •resistant and tense in his neck and body?
- •behind or above the vertical (the bit)?
- •unwilling to bend to the left or right?
- •moving with short steps?
- •refusing/rushing fences?
- •jumping with his back hollow?
- •heavy on left or right rein or pulls the reins through your hands?
- •does he flip or play with the bit?
- •tossing his head?

Watch Your Horse Eat:

- ·Is he slow?
- . Does he wet his hay before he eats it?
- •Do you find his hay in his water bucket?
- •Does he take a mouthful of hay before going to his grain?
- •Does he refuse to eat hard food?
- •Does he dive his head into the feed tub, or eat with his head up?



If a horse exhibits any of these symptoms, he probably needs the attention of an equine dental technician before his behavior can be modified through training. Many horses are labeled difficult when they are simply trying to say that their mouths hurt.
