Free Choice Minera Feeding



When we put a horse in our world - a domestic situation, it then will become our responsibility to meet their needs physically, mentally and emotionally. Attaining the knowledge to make informed decisions about our horses' diet is an obstacle that all horse owners face.

Horses are grazing animals. Their bodies are designed by nature for continuous movement and grazing. Living in the wild they travel many miles and have quite a variety in the diets. They have been observed eating tree bark, dirt, limestone, mineral deposits, herbs and grasses of many different varieties. They know instinctively what their bodies require.

Keeping a horse in a stall, paddock and/or small pasture is unnatural for them. We take away their abilities to balance their own nutritional needs by limiting what is available to them. Cribbing, eating manure, drinking from urine pools, sand colic, stall walking, stall weaving, food aggression and the eating of poisonous plants are a few of the behaviors that horses resort to in an attempt to meet their own needs or act out their frustrations of not having their needs met.

Minerals are an essential part of the structure but they also play an important role in the function of the body. When any of the elements are missing or lacking, the result will be structural weakness and system dysfunction or in other words disease.

The following minerals are generally recognized as essential to good health.

Calcium - a major mineral in the body, essential for normal bones and teeth, nervous and muscular system function, normal heart function and blood coagulation.

Magnesium - Activates enzyme systems, associated with phosphorus, zinc and nitrate utilization. A balancing mineral for calcium.

Copper - Necessary for activation of enzyme systems: helps iron in prevention of anemia: required with iron for formation of hemoglobin. Needed for healthy immune system and disease resistance and protection against internal parasites.

Manganese - associated with phosphorus utilization, iron assimilation, necessary for normal reproduction and part of the bone matrix.

Phosphorus - essential for bone and teeth growth, fat metabolism, Vitamin A & D metabolism and normal reproduction. Should be kept in balance with calcium and magnesium.

Potassium - Essential for carbohydrate metabolism, regulates thyroid, important for basic cellular metabolism and the regulation of fluids in the body. Important for nerve transmission.

Selenium - Required for normal metabolism through its interrelationship with Vitamin E. Helps the immune system.

Zinc - Essential for normal development of skin, hair, bones and eyes. Necessary for certain hormonal reproduction.

When you see how each of these minerals affect the development of life and the effects they have in maintaining healthy life, it is easy to get over-zealous in supplementation. But over supplementing of minerals can cause problems and can cause mineral deficiencies.

Calcium in excess will depress levels of manganese, magnesium, phosphorus and zinc which can lead to ailments like nervous behaviors, mastitis, respiratory ailments and warts.

Magnesium in excess will depress phosphorus and calcium which can lead to deformities, arthritis and founder to name a few.

Copper in excess will depress levels of Iron, zinc and phosphorus. Which can cause problems with reproduction and deformities in bones and teeth.

Manganese in excess will depress iron, phosphorus, potassium and magnesium leading to nervous behaviors, respiratory problems, string halt and navicular disease.

Phosphorus in excess will depress zinc, iron, calcium and magnesium. Ailments like founder, navicular, arthritis, warts, nervous behaviors and possible deformities can be the result.

Potassium in excess will depress sodium, iron and manganese.

Zinc in excess will depress iron, copper and phosphorus.

I think you get the idea.

To be efficiently utilized by the body, minerals must be in an organically bound form which means that they must be cheleted or joined to organic substances. The term chelation comes from the Greek word "chele" which means claw. A chelator is a molecule that grabs onto a mineral and holds it like a claw. In the process of manufacturing a true amino acid chelate, the amino acids are chemically bonded to the minerals. This process frees certain by-products such as chlorides, sulfates, carbonates, etc. which NEED to be removed during the manufacturing process to create a pure amino acid chelate. Some manufacturers are simply mixing minerals with amino acids and selling them as amino acid chelates. They are not forming the chemical bonds during preparation and therefore are not removing the by-products necessary for proper absorption.

Recent concerns about the depletion of our soils and the refining of our food has led to mineral supplementation in

ensure adequate nutrition. Unfortunately, as you can see, taking just any

form of minerals does not ensure that the minerals will be absorbed into the body and utilized by the tissues.

So back to our original question....should we feed our horses Free Choice Minerals? We believe that research has proven the importance of minerals in our diets and that of our horses. So the real question is the same old question that horse owners always run



into! Whom can I trust to give me the best advice on which minerals to feed my horse and whom can I trust to manufacture them? We believe that best source of information on what your horse needs is your horse. Given the choice of taking the minerals that his body needs or risk his health he will go for the mineral. Remember he is a prey animal and his instincts are to survive. Just like his wild counter-parts his body knows what it needs. He just needs to have it available WHEN he needs it in order to maintain balance. Free Choice Mineral feeding can allow your horses to balance themselves.

When force feeding mineral supplements daily, especially a supplement of poor quality, it is very easy to over supplement and cause an imbalance. Horses communicate through body language and most stable vices and "bad behaviors" are only the horse's way, usually out of frustration, of trying to tell you that it needs something and cannot get it. The horse's body feels out of balance and this makes the horse uncomfortable.

Choosing to put your horse on a Free Choice Mineral program is not a decision to take lightly. What you give your horse as Free Choice options is where the knowledge part comes in. We have already learned that for minerals to be efficiently utilized by the body we want to look for a quality product that has been properly chelated and by-products removed. There are companies out there that have been working in the field of Equine Nutrition for 20 - 30 years. You can benefit from their experience and their research. Look for organic and human grade quality ingredients. These products are high in quality and properly balanced. Less is more when the body is balanced.

Before feeding Free Choice Minerals, some factors have to be taken into consideration, such as feeding in group situations, pasture boarding, hay types and hay quality. Each horse's situation is unique and would require individual analysis. Investing the time to do this will give your horse the opportunity to be the best that he can be. 

Horseback Safaris - Standard one-hour, two-hour, or threehour horseback safaris are available daily. Horseback Safaris can be arranged for riders with varying levels of experience. All guests should be at least 12 years of age; 10 years





If horses were software..... A letter to tech support

Dear Tech Support,

Recently I purchased and installed Horse 1.0. I soon noticed that this program appears to have numerous glitches. For instance, every time my computer boots up, I have to run Feed 5.3 and Water 7.1. Many times I've been in the middle of writing an important document, and a window will flash telling me to run Clean Stall 2.0. This program also contained applications I did not wish to install, such as Manure 8.5, however they auto-installed with Horse 1.0. Applications such as Vacation 2.7 and Free Time 10.1 can no longer run, crashing whenever selected. Possibly the worst is that Horse 1.0 has attached itself to programs like Finance Manager and MS Money, with folders added such as "Monthly Shoeing" and "Winter Blanket". Periodically, I'll get a reminder telling me to send a check to the manufacturer of Horse 1.0 for the aforementioned items. I have tried to uninstall Horse 1.0 numerous times, but when I try to run the uninstall program, I get warning messages telling me that a deadly virus known as "Withdrawal" will infect my system. Please Help!!!!!

Dear User,

Your complaint is not unusual. A common misconception among users is that Horse 1.0 is a mere "utilities and entertainment program." It is not - it is an OPERATING SYSTEM and is designed by its' creator to run everything! A warning will soon be imprinted on the box. Since you have already installed Horse 1.0, here are a few tips on how to make it run better. If you are annoyed by the applications Feed 5.3 and Water 7.1, you may run C: \HIRE HELP, however this will cause another folder to be added to financial applications, labeled "Staff". Failure to send payment to "Staff" will result in Feed 5.3 and Water 7.1 being run again on startup. A note of caution: NOT booting up your computer for several days isn't the solution to avoiding Feed 5.3 and Water 7.1. You will find that, when you boot up your computer again, a nasty virus called "Colic 4.2" will have attached itself to important documents and the only way to rid your computer of Colic 4.2 is by purchasing and installing "Vet 10.1", which we admit is extremely expensive, but crucial. Otherwise, Colic 4.2 will cause irreversible damage to the operating system. Finally, it is important that you run C:\Carrots and C:\Scratch Ears on a fairly regular basis to keep the application running smoothly. If you have any more questions, please call our toll free number.
